To avoid injuries, boost morale and avoid citations you should:

- Keep floors, walkways, passages and egress doors clear of obstructions

- If you find a spill, clean it up.
- Don't block safety equipment such as fire extinguishers, first aid kits, showers and eye wash stations
- Put flammables away when not in use
- Don't let dust, grease or debris accumulate on equipment and machinery
- Get rid of those unused items.
