• Never assume others see you

Adapt to weather conditions

Use technology wisely

• Use GPS or routing tools before starting your drive—never while in motion.

Perform routine walkarounds

 A quick check before and after each stop helps catch loose hoses, flat tires, or objects near the wheels.
